## **Institute of Orthopaedics Lerdsin General Hospital**

Lerdsin General Hospital was founded by his Majesty King Rama The Fifth in 1889. The monarch donated "Ban-Loung", a government land, to set up an infirmary and gave the name "Ban-Loung Hospital". However, the people in this area were familiar with the name "Doctor Hays' Hospital" because Dr. T Howard Hays, an American missionary, was the hospital director at that time which was about 106 years ago.

In 1949, the name of the hospital was changed to "Lerdsin Hospital" to honor Mr. Lerd Sethabutr and his wife, Mrs. Sin Sethabutr, for their generous donation of 1,007,700 Baht (US\$251,925) for constructing a hospital building.

Lerdsin General Hospital belongs to the Ministry of Public Health. This 485 beds hospital occupies an area of 2.5 acres on Silom road which is the busiest commercial district in Bangkok comparable to the Wall Street in New York.

Orthopaedic Surgery began in 1957. Dr. Kong Suwanarat was the founding father of Orthopaedic Department and later became the President of the Thai Orthopaedic Association in 1975-1977.

In 1959, Dr. Pradit Saksri graduated with the Facharzt Für Orthopaedie Degree from Germany. He was the first Orthopaedic surgeon in Thailand to performed an AO technique internal fixation with plate and screw. The first Total Hip Replacement with Thompson-Brunswick prosthesis was also achieved here.

Dr. Ekachai Jurajarit, Physiatrist, improved the Rehabilitation Unit and established the Orthotic and Prosthetic School in 1978. The school accepted 15 students yearly and in the present 160 students have graduated.

Dr. Pongsak Vathana returned from America in 1973. He was trained at Ochsner Clinic, Ochsner Foundation Hospital, New Orleans, Louisiana, USA. and was the Hand




Fig. 2 Orthopaedic staffs at Institute of Orthopaedics (front from the left) Dr. Narongchai Pattarabanjird, Dr. Thavat Prasartritha, Dr. Chaisit Intuwongse, Dr. Pongsak Vathana, Dr. Namchai Varodompun, Dr. Wallob Samranvedhya. (Back from the left) Dr. Suriyapong Saowaprut, Dr. Vera Sathira-Angkura, Dr. Sombat Kunakornsawat, Dr. Somsak Leechavengvongs, Dr. Boonyaruk Visutipol, Dr. Anant Setpakdi.

The Institute of Orthopaedics was established out of the Department of Orthopaedic, Lerdsin Hospital in October 31, 1993. The Institute has 135 beds with 42,096 outpatients, 3,098 in-patients and 4,025 operations per year.

The Institute of Orthopaedics is one of twelve Orthopaedic Centers in Thailand and accredited by the Thai Medical Council since 1975. Currently, there are 60 Orthopaedic Surgeons completed their training from this Institute.
