

## **ASEAN ORTHOPAEDIC ASSOCIATION**

Annual Report: 5th-8th December 2007 to 26th - 29th June 2008

This annual report covers the numerous activities of the ASEAN Orthopaedic Association for the period from 5<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> December 2007 to 25<sup>th</sup>-29<sup>th</sup> June 2008 under the control of the 27<sup>th</sup> AOA Council.

A) The 27<sup>th</sup> AOA Annual Council Meeting- Ho Chi Minh, Vietnam.

The 27<sup>th</sup> AOA Annual Council Meeting was held on Wednesday, Dec. 5, 2007 at the Majestic Hotel, in Ho Chi Minh, Vietnam. The meeting started at 8.30 am and was chaired by outgoing President Dr. Bambang Tiksnadi and co-chaired by Dr. Vo Van Thanh, incoming AOA President.

The report for this Council Meeting will be given by Dr. Ellewellyn G. Pasion, the incoming AOA Secretary General for 2008.

Dr. Vo Van Thanh was elected as President of the ASEAN Orthopaedic Association, and Dr. Ellewellyn G. Pasion was elected as Secretary General succeeding Dr. Ong Leong Boon. The rest of the Office Bearers for 2008 will appear in the report of the minutes of the meeting.

B) The 27<sup>th</sup> AOA Annual Meeting- 5<sup>th</sup> -8<sup>th</sup> December 2007

The 27th ASEAN Orthopaedic Association Annual Meeting / 6<sup>th</sup> Vietnam Orthopaedic Association/ 12th Vietnam Spine Society of HCM City, was very successfully held on the 5th-8th December 2007 at the Majestic Hotel, Ho Chi Minh, Vietnam. The theme was Education, Training and Development. The Organizing Committee was chaired by Dr. Vo Van Thanh. The Vice Chairmen were Drs. Nguen Tien Binh, Ngo Van Toan, Pham Dang Nhat, Nguyen Van Quang; the Secretary General was Vo Van Chau; the Deputy Sec-general was Dr. Nguyen Dac Nghia. The Congress Treasurer was Dr. Nguyen Trong Anh. The Scientific Program was chaired by various eminent Vietnamese Orthopedic surgeons in the different subspecialties of Orthopaedics namely; Shoulder and Knee Arthroscopy, Hip and Knee Arthroplasty, Shoulder Arthroplasty, Hand and Microsurgery, Spine and Pediatric Orthopaedics. Special guest included Prof. John CY Leong, SICOT President, Prof. Po Quang Chen, APOA President; Prof. Shoichi Kokubun, President, APOA Spine Section. Invited speakers were from the USA, France, Australia, Japan, Korea, Taiwan,

and the 6 ASEAN countries, Indonesia, Malaysia, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam. The Congress was very well attended by the ASEAN orthopaedic community and was very successful in all aspects, scientific, social, and cultural. It definitely boosted the development of orthopaedics in the ASEAN region.

# C) Zimmer 17<sup>th</sup> ASEAN-American Orthopaedic Association Traveling Fellowship

This year, the AOA-AOA Traveling Fellowship was again sponsored by Zimmer. This year, Ms. Lisa O'Brien of the AOA Staff was the person responsible for all the arrangements in the US side. The AOA Travel agent, Tomi Gaudio booked the flights of all the Traveling Fellows from country of origin to US, and all internal flights and travel, using the credit cards submitted by all the Traveling Fellows. Unfortunately some of the Fellows' concern was the late remittance of Zimmer of the \$5000 financial support supposed to be given to the different National Associations. They were reassured however that their National Associations will transfer the amount of \$5000 to their bank accounts once it is remitted by Zimmer. Ms O'Brien arranged for the hotel accommodations in the different places to be visited in the USA also using the credit cards of the Traveling Fellows.
